Year 6 Trip to SafetyWorks!

On Tuesday 5th December 2017 Year 6 went on a fantastic trip to SafetyWorks! in Newcastle.

This trip was about our safety and the decisions we make in our life.

There were different subjects and they were: road safety, railway safety, ambulance work, fire safety and police. In road safety we were taught to cross roads without getting hurt.

After that we did railway safety. We were told not go on the track for any reason.

Later on in the day we did ambulance work. In the room there was a kitchen that had different hazards and we had to tell the man and he would let you go and fix them.

Next we did fire safety: you had to sit in a room and you had to look in a room and there was a red flashing light and you had to get outside and call the fire fighters.

At the end of the day we did police work. The lady told us to never get a criminal record. It was a great trip!







Year 7 Trip - Ford & Etal

On Monday the 13th Year 7 visited Ford and Etal Estates to learn about forestry (and to get our bird box wood). We learnt all about the money made, workers needed and the machines that they use. One of the main small machines can chop down a standard tree in a matter of seconds; this amazing piece of technology believe it or not is just like all your games consoles and is specifically designed to be like this! And best of all we got to watch one work - it was amazing! The only downside to this amazing machine was its cost - £70,000! The large part cost nearly £45,000 and the small part cost nearly £30,000! The people who work here only go to each wood every 5-7 years; this process is called thinning. They originally plant thousands of trees but over the years they take out the weaker ones. Next we moved on to the sawmill (where we would receive our planks.) We saw how they cut square fence poles out of circle trees. Believe it or not each tree was only worth £18. However square poles are no longer the best kind of pole; circular poles are far more resistant and durable than square poles as they have more of the strongest part of the tree (the centre) in it. Next we received our planks, thanked our guide and got on the bus home. When we got home we placed our planks in the technology room, thanked Mr Deane-Hall and went home.









Remembrance

On the 10th November 2017 we celebrated Remembrance Day. A call from the Western Front Association had come a few weeks before hand to tell us about a WW1 letter writing competition. For this competition we had to write a letter from a person involved in WW1, whether it be a soldier, a girl in the factory, a mother, or anyone else, to a friend or family member. The winner was to be announced in our Remembrance assembly.

So, the day of the assembly arrived, and we had all prepared the letters. However, first, the real deal. We were actually here to remember all the brave people who fought-both home and away- to give us the future that we all are so fortunate to have. The soldiers, the people at home and the school children, who were just like us, that witnessed four horrible years of war.


We talked about the war, we watched a video about war inflicted countries in the present day, and we paid our respects by holding a two-minute silence.


"I had one of the songs about me. I achieved more than I thought I could."
