Headteacher Headlines

Welcome to our Spring Bulletin – in these pages you will find just some of the wonderful things that your children have been learning about and exploring here in school and out on educational visits over the last term. It has been all go since we came back from the Christmas break with two very short but successful (and snowy) half terms. The children have been working incredibly hard in response to the raised expectations that the National Curriculum now demands of them. Our Year 6 students in particular have responded well to the demands of the new End of Key Stage testing and are preparing well for those assessments in the summer term.

Over the course of the last terms we have been engaging in regular 'Snack & chat' sessions on a Friday afternoon. These are informal sessions where pupils from each year group come together with Mr Tong and myself and we spend around an hour discussing diverse aspects of our school and of the children's learning experiences (along with having some lovely fresh fruit to enjoy). We are also usually joined by one of the school governors who also come to listen to what the children have to say. Our discussions this term have focused around safety, school meals and reading. Children's responses were very positive regarding feeling safe at school, they enjoyed our hot meals but did have some ideas for the kitchen team to consider for next term (our homemade soups were a real hit but some children were not keen on the cheese we have and would like us to try a different type). Our discussion on reading was most enlightening with the vast majority of children sharing a pleasing love of reading and a desire for us to make more time for reading for pleasure in school. The children also asked us to see if we could arrange for the mobile library van to visit the school regularly, particularly those children who lived outside of Wooler who found accessing the local library hard. Cllr Murray was present at that session and has taken the request back to the County Council to see what can be achieved. We are ending the term with our sponsored walk - fingers crossed for good weather as it should be a lovely day out in the hills. I hope you enjoy reading through our Spring Bulletin and all at school would like to wish you a very Happy Easter.

The first sari she demonstrated on me, she put a waistcoat on Finley and a turban on Alexander. Following that she used water based paint to draw beautiful symbolic patterns on our faces and hands. After that she performed a song/prayer to Vishnu using 5 special objects to represent the 5 senses. Next we had lunch which was a speciality curry dish with tomatoes, peas and flat bread. For dessert we had ice cream and chocolate sauce. Then we said goodbye to Kirditta, put our shoes on and went home.
