#### **UGANDA VISIT**

During our three week trip to Uganda we spent 7 days taking part in project work in the lush, green, mountainous and remote Bwindi Impenetrable Forest where we spent our time working on environmental projects with a local charity. Bwindi is home to the mountain gorillas, and is an ancient forest which is under pressure from the people living and working there. We took part in projects which seek to help educate the people about how they can protect and live in harmony with the forest. We collected indigenous tree seedlings, assisted local nurseries, worked in local schools, and even helped to build two Smokeless ovens that the school canteen staff were very grateful for. We also got involved with community reforestation initiatives. In the schools we also discussed health issues, and helped them learn the importance of basic hand washing, as well as learning ourselves about local traditional practices. At the end of each day, the team discussed the high points they enjoyed, and challenges they faced.

The children also visited safari lodges and took part in two safari drives across the plains of Uganda, witnessing hippos, Elephants, Lions, Cheetahs, Crocodiles and lots more amazing wildlife.

During one night in a safari game park Hippos came into camp and wandered around our tents. We had to stay in the tents until they had gone.
