Activity 1:

Using slide 2, make a list of all the things that a sketch map should have. Answer these questions fully explaining your reasoning:

Why should a sketch map include:

- A title
- A frame
- A key
- A north arrow
- A simple line drawing

Activity 2:

Click through the slide that shows you how to draw a sketch map of the River Elbe in Germany. Use what you have learned to draw a sketch map of the Baska Voda Port in Croatia.
